
The must read book for all managers! Mandatory reading for those in the Paint Industry!

The celebrations are in the form of village level (adarsh gram) RPL certifications for artisans in select Sector Skill Councils. Paints and Coatings Sector Skill Council, one of the selected sector skill councils, has selected 25 villages in 5 States (U.P, Gujarat, Bihar, Assam and Tamil Nadu).
